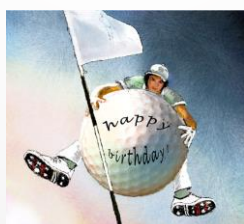

Check out the club merchandise, and let the editor know before the 15th August your requirements, as I'll order them then.

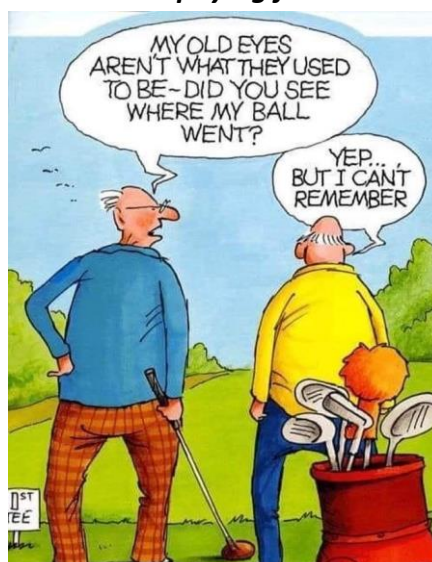

Personal Note from Mick Gembarovski:

On the 27th June I received the tragic news that Steve Romaniw had unexpectedly taken his last breath in Warsaw. He was on a mission in Lithuania fighting for justice in the Russian war against Ukraine.

I knew Steve from my childhood years through Ukrainian school, CYM and the church. Even though we were on opposite sides of the railway tracks, Tullamarine and Airport West nevertheless we were friends.

Steve was always involved in the Ukrainian community and always had Ukrainian youth and the progression of Ukrainian culture at the centre of his mind and heart. At an early age he had the passion and drive to be involved in all things Ukrainian which led him on an upward trajectory in the Ukrainian community. Some achievements are head of CYM, head of the Australian Federation of Ukrainian Organisations, Vice president of the Ukrainian World Congress, multicultural ambassador in the Victorian government, received an OAM amongst many more accolades. His life was dedicated to multicultural Australia, to the advancement of Ukrainian heritage in a country where our displaced

parents migrated after WW2 and fled the persecution of Russia, some never to return and all saddened by current events.

I recently bumped into him at Keilor cemetery during the blessing of the graves. There was no discussion of the troubles in the world. We talked about the Bombers and how happy we were with their season so far. He was always a passionate supporter.

He always made time to say hello if he saw you down the street, always asked about extended family, he knew everybody. Nobody was insignificant.

There is so much more that could be said about Steve a mountain of achievements, but at this stage I have a lump in my throat and a tear in my eye.

You touched us all profoundly.

A State Funeral Service to honour the life of Stefan Romaniw OAM was held at 10 am on Friday, 12 July at Sts Peter and Paul Ukrainian Catholic Cathedral. It was live streamed so that those who could not attend the service could watch from home.

Stefan was a fierce champion of multiculturalism and diversity in Victoria, and he firmly believed that our differences can only enrich us all for the better.

He was a tireless advocate who used the power of his revered voice to fight for others, a voice he often used to speak out against the war in Ukraine. He made it his life's work to preserve Ukrainian culture and identity, both in Australia and abroad.

Stefan served our state as the Executive Director of Community Languages Australia and previously as the Chair of the Victorian Multicultural Commission and Multicultural Arts Victoria.

He also held a number of leadership roles within the broader Australian and Ukrainian communities, including the Australian Federation of Ukrainian Organisations, as 1st Vice President of the Ukrainian World Congress, and as a member of the Starlight Foundation Victorian Advisory Board, amongst others.

For his services to multiculturalism in Australia, Stefan was awarded a Medal of the Order of the Australia in 2001.

The State Funeral Service was an opportunity for Victorians to pay tribute to Stefan's contribution to Victoria and his unwavering dedication to our multicultural communities.

He told the pro that he wanted to work on swing mechanics, so the pro asked him to hit a few balls with his 9-iron so he could watch his swing. He addressed the ball, double-checked his stance and grip, executed his take-away and backswing, his downswing and follow through. But he toed the ball, and sliced it way off into the nearest fairway. He looked back at the pro for advice, who told him “Your problem is obvious Sir — it’s LOFT.”

The golfer scratched his head, went to his bag and pulled out his driver. He repeated his routine, and topped the ball, sending it dribbling 30 yards out on the practice range. He looked at the pro for a suggestion, who advised him “Your problem is still LOFT.”

The frustrated student then pulled out a 5-iron, took his swing and struck an ugly duck hook. The pro again told him “I’m sorry, but your problem is still LOFT.”

The golfer struggled to maintain his cool, and asked the pro, “I don’t understand. I hit my first shot with my 9-iron, and you said my problem was loft. Then I took my least lofted club, hit it again, and you said my problem was still loft. Then I grabbed a middle iron, and you told me once again that my problem was loft. What exactly do mean by LOFT?”

The pro looked at him and explained, “LOFT – Lack Of F@#\$ing Talent!”

Do you suffer from LOFT?

Golf tip: At the start of the round, you’re not warmed up, rusty as hell and a little anxious. Try hitting an iron off the tee, just like Stefan Moskaljuk at Melbourne Airport on the 30th June, and then creaming another iron onto the green to take out the drive and chip, but only just. Staying out of the trees will save you many shots. Or, just go for it, like I do! 😊

Golfer: What should I hit?

Caddy: Try the fairway...



Golf tip: As a group, watch where your playing partner’s ball goes, so you can at least give them a hard time, and speed up the time required to locate their ball. Especially when hitting into the sun or ricochets off the trees, you need all eyes on watch.

Chef's Kitchen

PETE'S LAMB CURRY

By The Editor



Yes, this is my recipe!

I've a large frypan with a glass lid (13" or 33cm across, and 2.5" or 6.4 cm deep).
Ingredients are for this size container.
Serves 10.

Ingredients

(Na oko – by eye – or a rough guide)
Virgin Olive Oil (a decent drizzle)
Cumin Seeds (1 teaspoon)
Onions (2 large – diced)
Garlic (finely diced – you choose quantity)
1.2+ kilo Lamb (diced – trim fat and discard)
Curry Paste (yellow, red and/or green)
(1 heaped dessert spoon of each – or less!)
Turmeric Powder (1 teaspoon)
3 Capsicum (green, red and/or yellow)
(diced)
3 to 4 Tomatoes (diced)
Mushrooms (diced – optional)
10 small washed potatoes (whole)
Any old vegetables due to expire.

Serving Suggestions

Basmati Rice
Greek Yogurt (optional)

Recipe

Prepare all ingredients (the tedious part), store into bowls as needed.



Heat the oil, add the Cumin Seeds (mix into oil for about a minute). Add the garlic and onion – cook until softened – stirring the mix as you go.



Add Lamb (no need to brown)

Add Turmeric powder then the curry paste, stir for a about 30 seconds.

Add the capsicum and stir in.



Place the potatoes into the mix.

Turn the heat down to a very low heat, as we need lots of cooking time.

Add all other ingredients (without mixing in), tomatoes and mushrooms last.



Cover and simmer on low heat for a minimum of two hours.

After an hour, check every now and again and stir, test the mix, you might want more curry if you like it feisty! 😊

When you can no longer stand the aromas, serve.

All going well, the lamb will be very juicy!
